

#### IT'S THE LAW... WE NEED TO PROTECT STUDENT INFORMATION

According to NYS law, school districts must protect students' personal information. That means that the IT department must ask each company to sign a contract stating that they will not sell our student information and that they are taking reasonable steps to protect the data they collect.

What kinds of data must we protect? See below.

## PROTECTION OF PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION (PII)



Education Law Section 2-d and Part 121 of the Commissioner's Regulations outline requirements for educational agencies and their third-party contractors **in order to protect student and annual professional performance review personally identifiable information**. Districts need to balance the benefits of using data and the responsibility to minimize the collection of PII in order to reduce risk. Additionally, educational agencies can not sell or disclose PII for commercial purposes. To learn more about protected data, agencies can review Part 121.2, 121.5 and 121.7 of the Regulations.

#### PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION

Personally identifiable information (PII) includes information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity either directly or indirectly through linkages with other information.

## **ED LAW 2D FAQS**

Over the past year and a half, most districts are charged with having to get signed contracts with as many companies as possible to be in compliance.

What needs to be approved by the IT department?

In short, anything that could collect information about students. This includes obvious programs, like websites students log into, but it also includes extensions that you, their teachers, use. Believe it or not, extensions installed in your Chrome browser may be reading the sites you visit and could be collecting and storing that information without your knowledge or intent.

How do I find out if an app or website is already approved?

Ask your district for a complete list of apps or websites that are Ed Law 2d compliant.

Whom can I contact if I have any questions regarding Education Law 2D?

Please contact your administrator and or district data privacy coordinator with any questions you may have regarding Education Law 2D. If there are questions that they cannot answer, then you may contact the NYSED Privacy Office at privacy@nysed.gov.
