BECOME A TEACHER TODAY!!! SHARE YOUR KNOWLEDGE TO SHAPE OUR CHILDREN'S FUTURE!!

Business education teachers in New York are certified to teach grades Pre K-12 and can work in a variety of different settings, including elementary school, middle school, and high school. Before becoming a teacher in the state of New York, individuals must earn a bachelor's degree, meet exam requirements, and complete one or more workshops.

Education/Experience Required	A minimum of a bachelor's degree
Exams Required	NYSTCE Educating All Students (EAS) test, NYSTCE Content Specialty Test (CST) - Business and Marketing or Safety Net Business and Marketing test
Certification Validity Period	5 years
Advancement Requirements	Master's degree or completion of mentored work experience
Mean Salary (2018)*	Elementary school - \$83,010, Middle school- \$83,490, High school - \$85,300
Estimated Job Growth Nationwide (2016-2026)*	Elementary school - 7%, Middle school - 8%, High school - 8%

To become a New York teacher, a candidate must meet the requirements stipulated by the Office of Teaching Initiatives. Like most states, New York requires that all state teachers hold a bachelor's degree, complete a New York teacher certification program, and pass the required content examinations. Upon meeting the requirements for certification, an applicant may be issued an initial certificate, which is valid for five years. This entry-level certificate leads to the professional certificate, which is an advanced level license that is continuously valid, assuming the teacher completes the appropriate number of professional development hours every five years.

The most direct, traditional route to New York teaching certification is to complete an approved teacher preparation program at a New York college or university and be recommended for certification by the certification officer at that university, which is known as an institutional recommendation. 
